OHPAHO SECONDARY SCHOOL EXAM INFORMATION

*OSS is using the online platform, VRETTA to implement all Provincial Achievement Exams for grade 9. Students have had an opportunity to use the platform in class prior to the PAT exams.

*The VRETTA platform has built-in accommodations, such as a reader, for those students that have an ISP. Headphones will be provided for those students that require the use of a reader.

*Teachers will speak to individual students about their accommodations based on their ISP and/or Accommodation Checklist. Once the teacher has spoken to individual students the Learning Support Teacher will send out a document to each parent and student outlining the accommodations they have chosen to use for each assessment and where the student would go to access these accommodations.

*All students are eligible to use double the time for which a PAT or Diploma is designed. For example, an exam may be allotted 120 minutes but a student can use up to 240 minutes to write that exam if required.

*Some exams will be administered in our small gymnasium in a group setting. Strict measures will be in place to ensure the security of all exam materials and to maintain the integrity of the quiet examination environment throughout the entire session. This is the standard whether the exam is in a classroom or the gymnasium.

*It is possible that should students take an extended amount of time for either a PAT or a diploma exam, they may be required to move to a different exam space in order to finish their exam.

*Students must show up to the exam prepared with the materials they need including pencils, eraser, and a calculator for those exams in which a calculator is permitted.

*PATs serve as final exam marks. Students are expected to write them and may not receive a mark without a government-approved exemption. Those who miss the PAT must write an alternate exam.

* For the May 29th written Grade 9 PAT ELA exam, students will join their class once they have completed the written exam.

*During exam week in June, all Grade 8 and 9 students are expected to remain at school after their exam unless parents have completed the "Permission to Leave" form posted on the Parent Portal (not yet released)
